## **RULES**

- 1 All vegetables and flowers in Divisions 1 and 2 must be grown by the exhibitor and all entries in Divisions 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 must be made by the exhibitor.
- 2 All exhibits must be staged from 8.30 to 10.00 am. on the Show Day. No article may be removed from the stage before 4.30 p.m. on that day, unless permission is received from the Secretary.
- 3 Any entry not removed by 5.30 p.m. will become the property of the Committee and may be sold. All prize monies to be collected on the day of the show or will be forfeited.
- 4 All exhibits, personal property etc., will be at the risk of the exhibitor and the Committee will not be liable for the loss or damage or injury or any cause whatsoever.
- 5 Whilst the Judges are at work no person will be allowed in the tent. Judging will take place between 10.00 am. and 1.00 p.m. The Judges' decision will be final.
- 6 Any person breaking Regulations 1 and 2 forfeit their prize and will not be allowed to exhibit another year without the consent of the Committee.
- 7 Whenever possible exhibitors are asked to name the varieties exhibited.
- 8 Entries to be submitted in the name of one person.
- 9 **Exhibitors must pay the charges for entering the field.**
